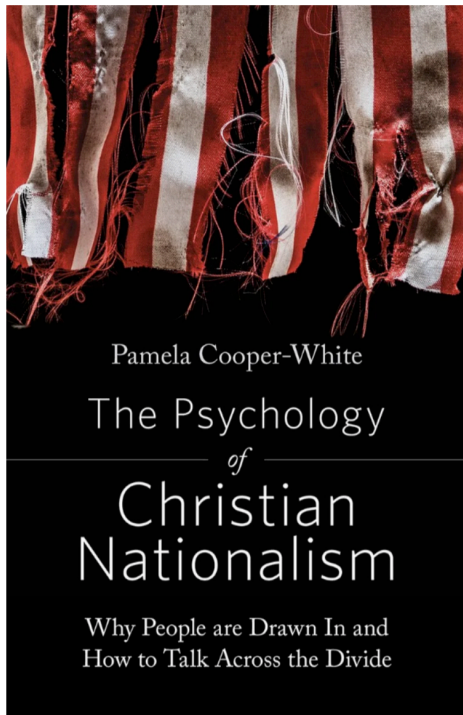




Understanding The Psychology of Christian Nationalism

Join the [Racial Justice and Healing Committee](#) for a three-session book study on [The Psychology of Christian Nationalism](#) by Pamela Cooper-White. Sessions will follow a curriculum written by the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles, [Tackling the Truths of a Toxic Movement](#).

In three short chapters, Cooper-White uncovers the troubling extent of Christian nationalism, explores its deep psychological roots, and discusses ways in which advocates for justice can safely and effectively attempt to talk across the deep divides in our society.

Meetings will be held on Tuesdays June 30, July 14, and July 28 from 6:30 to 8 p.m. on Zoom and discussion will be led by members of the Racial

Justice and Healing Committee. Each session will be focused on a different chapter of the book.
