## St. Luke's Annual Meeting Highlights



St. Luke's 2012 Annual Parish Meeting took place on January 27 after the Sunday service and a tasty potluck lunch. Twenty-six parishioners attended, along with Rev. Carol Wageman, Interim Rector for St. Luke's, officiating. Rev. Carole opened the meeting at noon with a prayer and appointed Lillian Willis as Recording Secretary.

- Minutes: In the absence of precise minutes from the 2011 Annual Meeting, the Parish Meeting Highlights, as written in the 2012 Annual Report, were approved as a replacement. Rev. Carole explained the recommendation that no changes be made to the present configuration of the Vestry (even those whose term should have just ended.) The reason being it enables the leadership of the parish to remain stable while other things are in flux with the presence of a new interim and the beginning work of a Ministry Discernment Committee.
- Elections: Formal elections approved the slate of Sara Gagnon, Jean Hancock, and Mike Saul as Delegates to the Diocesan Convention and the slate of Richard Crocker, Lew Watters, and Kathryn Wright as Alternates. All those present gratefully accepted the following volunteer Chairpersons for fundraising events: (con't. above right)

• Ministry Discernment Committee (MDC): Chairman Lew Watters introduced the MDC members present and



stressed that the search process should be a transparent one involving as many members of the parish as possible and that all are welcome to attend MDC meetings. The committee will be seeking a rector and does not have geographical limits to the search. The MDC will consult the past church profile and other relevant material. The committee will meet on February 24, with Lynn Bates, Diocesan Canon to the

Ordinary & Transition Minister, to focus on the gifts each committee member brings to the process.

• MDC "Parking Lot": Rev. Carole facilitated a discussion and recording of a brainstorming "Parking Lot" exercise. While there will be other parish-wide gatherings generated by the MDC to gather further specific input, all involved felt we should take advantage of the annual meeting format to collect the hopes, wishes, fears, and questions that people might have in the early stages of the search process. The brainstorm list\* was turned over to the MDC as one piece of information for its early reference. (\*This list, as typed up by MDC Chair, Lew Watters, will be made available in a number of locations to be determined.) Other suggestions of material to be considered include Vestry Retreat notes from the session with Martha Stretton on the Mission Statement and parish asset mapping.

## Annual Meeting con't. ...

Rev. Carole announced that she and the members of the Transition Team (Lew Watters, Chair MDC; Kathryn Wright, Senior Warden; and Lynn Bates, Diocesan Transition Minister) plan to have monthly phone discussions about the progress of the transition process.



• Presentation of the 2013 Budget. In Treasurer Sally Hoover's absence, Finance Committee Member Peter Rosengarten praised Sally's excellent work and pointed out that Sanford Johnson, Priest Associate (who also was absent), receives no remuneration for all the work he does regularly as volunteer clergy for the parish. Peter reviewed the finances for 2011 (deficit of \$12,847.44) and 2012 (surplus of \$9,012.58 because of Father Paul's early retirement), and

projected that the proposed 2013 budget, which had been approved by the Vestry, was realistic because the present Interim Rector is half time. However the church, built in 1868, needs some repairs in 2013; and there has been a drop in full-time pledges—a situation that needs to be addressed.

The meeting closed with a prayer by Rev. Carole and was adjourned at 1:05 p.m..— *Lillian Willis*

The Passover Seder marks the night when the Israelites were "passed over" by the angel of death when the tenth and final plague (the death of all the firstborn) was visited upon Egypt. The angel passed over all homes marked by lamb's blood on the lintel

and two doorposts. The original verb for "pass over" is posach, and its noun form is pesach. Thus, the lamb whose blood on the lintel and two doorposts ensured salvation, was referred to as the paschal lamb. The paschal lamb was then eaten that night: "and ye shall eat it in haste: it is the Lord's Passover." (Exodus 12:11).

The menu is traditional and within our parish family we have gifted cooks to prepare the lamb, goat and chicken, roasted potatoes, tasty vegetables, tossed salad, macaroons and meringue treats. **Seder** is a Hebrew word meaning "order" so there are special requirements like bitter herbs (radishes, horseradishes), matzah, haroset (apples, cinnamon and nuts), parsley and of course, boiled eggs. Preparation of the meal is one of the highlights of the celebration of the Seder. A favorite part of the evening for the children is when the leader breaks the middle of the three Matzah, leaving one half on the plate. The other half, called the "afikoman" is hidden and will be eaten after the children have found it at dessert time. The child who finds the hidden afikoman receives a prize.

Kathryn Wright and Bonnie Watters are organizing this year's dinner so if you have questions or wish to volunteer to help, be sure to let them know. Also look for a sign-up sheet at church. Here you can make your commitment to come, to cook, to prepare that Sunday afternoon and to clean up.

Space is limited to about 85, so make your reservations early and be sure to include Jewish families in our community in your plans. Circle the date March 24th on your calendars to ensure you don't miss out on this special event leading into Holy Week.


